About the Institution

Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur, Dist. Kangra (H.P.) recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956, is a constituent college of Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. It was established as Arya College for Girls in June 1978 with a meagre strength of 20 girls. The institution was started in the sacred memory of Swami Dayanand Saraswati, whose name stands among the greatest social and religious reformers of modern India, who propounded that knowledge should be imparted without prejudice of caste, creed and sex and that the basic purpose of propagating real education is to inculcate love for Indian cultural ethics in consonance with the Vedic ideas of universal brotherhood.

The Arya College for Girls was taken over by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh on 25th June 2002 as a co-educational institution and named as Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur with only Humanities. From the academic session 2009-10, this institution also started Science (Medical & non-medical) and commerce classes, thereby fulfilling the long-standing demand and aspirations of the people of this area.

The University Grants Commission launched an employment-oriented scheme on skill development as a part of college/ university education. This vocational degree programme (B. Voc.) started in our college w.e.f. June 2017 with two courses having 40 seats each, one in Retail Management and the other in Hospitality & Tourism.

Having made a mark on the educational horizon of the Himachal Pradesh University, our college strives to create an environment conducive to continuous academic, and co-curricular activities and holistic development of students as well as staff members. For this purpose, consistent efforts have always been made by all stakeholders to foster, encourage and motivate ideas and put them into practice. College tries to inculcate all the values enshrined in our constitution; the values of liberty, equality, justice and brotherhood. We encourage a sense of tolerance for different cultures and opinions among our students.

A notice regarding setting of question papers for each course is circulated among teachers and they are asked to set and submit the question papers of their respective subjects within a given time. The answer books and question papers are printed after completing all the codal formalities through proper channels. 








Figure 5: Occupational details of Bhatka village.







Brief Report:
 The lecturer begins by describing the following:
Why Many Empire-shaking Battles at Panipat?
 Panipat and its adjacent region, located in present Haryana on the banks of the Yamuna and between the fertile plains of the Ganga and Indus rivers, have witnessed several battles. These battles shaped the course of Indian history at different points of time.
 • The first battle of Panipat in 1520 was between Babur and Ibrahim Lodi. The result of the battle laid the foundation of the Mughal Empire by ending the rule of the Delhi Sultanate.
 • The Second Battle of Panipat in 1556 was between Akbar and Hemu; it decided in favour of the continuation of the Mughal rule.
 • The Third Battle of Panipat in 1761 between the Marathas and Ahmad Shah Abdali put an end to the Maratha ambitions of ruling over India.

Why Panipat was a favourite battle field?
 • Panipat had a strategic location. One of the parties of the war generally came from the north/northwest through the Khyber Pass to get hold over Delhi, the political capital of northern India.
 • To cross a military through rough terrain—mountains of Rajasthan or the other northern areas infested with dense forests—was very risky and difficult. On the other hand, the rivers at Delhi surrounded Panipat as a comfortable strategic ground and hence they preferred to take the fight there.
 • Its proximity to Delhi made it easier for the Indian rulers to transport weapons, military and food supplies etc., to the battleground, and still keep the capital insulated from the conflict at hand.
 • Panipat's surrounding region has a flat ground which was suitable for cavalry movements—the main mode of warfare at the time.
 • After the construction of the Grand Trunk Road by Sher Shah Suri (1540-45), Panipat was on this route. It became easier for conquerors to find their way there.
 • The duration of monsoon rainfall in the region is short in comparison to other areas making it easier to fight.
 • The artisans/crafts of these regions were experts in making warfare-related materials and hence it became easier for forces of both parties to establish their war materials.


















Training Programme on Working of Virtual Classrooms

Nest composition of Himalayan bulbul *Pycnonotus leucogenys*: A study in Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh

Abstract

The nest composition of Himalayan Bulbul *Pycnonotus leucogenys* was studied in a village of Chamba district in Himachal Pradesh. The observation were carried out during the month of July 2024. The various parameters of the naturally built nest such as shape, size and weight along with number, weight and types of constituents formed the nest were studied. The photographic evidence was recorded with the help of a digital camera (Nikon Coolpix A500) and measurements were done with the help of a measuring tape and an electronic weighing balance. The observations were as follows: height of the nest above the ground, 3.2 meters; weight, 4.78 g; size, outer dimensions L: 11 cm x W: 10 cm x H: 6.0 cm; inner dimensions L: 7.6 cm x W: 7.6 cm x D: 4.0 cm. The nest structure consisted of dead shoot/branches of Indian Gooseberry *Eugenia jambolana* (57%), sticky hair bearing shoot/branches of Barbed Ficus *Macleaya cordata* (10%), inflorescence bearing shoot/branches of Congrus grass *Peristichia foetida* (4%) and another grass (1%), plant stem fibers (3%), plant root / rootlet fibers (2%) and fine plastic fibers (1%). The length of constituents forming the nest varied from 6.3 cm to 21.9 cm and the average length of most of the constituents was 14.2 cm to 16.7 cm. Out of 3 eggs laid in the nest, only one hatching could develop up to fledging stage. The present study reveals that the nest composition of Himalayan Bulbul consisted of 7 different types of constituents out of which higher percentage was contributed by shoot/branches of plants followed by stem fibers & rootlet fibers of plants, lesser number of inflorescence bearing shoot/branches of grasses and a few plastic fibers.

Introduction

The distribution of Himalayan Bulbul *Pycnonotus leucogenys* varies in altitude from 300 m to 2400 m amsl and is distributed throughout the Himalayas from Afghanistan to Punjab hills, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh hills, Nepal, Bhutan and Arunachal Pradesh. The bird occurs in almost all kinds of habitats ranging from open scrub, gardens, forests, agricultural lands, towns and villages. The bird is resident with some local movements at higher elevations in winter. The breeding season varies from April to August (Whistler, 1941; Ali and Ripley, 1969; Puri, 1932; Parul et al., 2013) ^{1, 2, 3, 4}. The nest is built on low branches of trees, shrubs, bushes, ceilings of buildings, garden creepers and tucked into the thicket of a dwelling. The nest is built at a height of 30 cm to 3 meters above the ground (Baker, 1932; Ali and Ripley, 1969) ^{5, 6}. The eggs are pale olive, dusky speckled, streaked or blotched with various shades of red, grey spots and streaks of underlying pale olive parts. The clutch size varies from 2-5, usually 3 and occasionally 5. The eggs are laid at 24-hour intervals and the incubation period is about 13 days. The second period of incubation, molting and fledging is about 25-26 days and from nest building to fledging is about 4 weeks (Baker, 1932; Bates and Lovell, 1952; Ali and Ripley, 1969; Parul et al., 2013; Kumar and Kumar, 2021) ^{1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7}.

The range of distribution of Himalayan Bulbul in Himachal Pradesh as recorded by the author varies from 150 m to 2750 m from sub-tropical to temperate regions in a variety of habitats (Singh, 2015) ⁸. As per BirdLife International IUCN Red List, the status of bird is Least Concern (BirdLife International, 2024) ⁹.

Despite the number of studies carried out about breeding of Himalayan Bulbul since the last many years, the information regarding constituents of the nest composition was found insufficient. Therefore, a present study was undertaken to investigate the composition of a naturally built nest of Himalayan Bulbul.

Materials and methods

Study Area

The present study was carried out in a village (Kamra) located in Ribna sub-district of district Chamba in Himachal Pradesh (Figure 1). The study area is located at an altitude of about 1020 m amsl with coordinates: 32°28' N and 76°07' E. The three main seasons of the area are summer, monsoon & winter along with transitional periods of autumn & spring. The climate of the area is subtropical.

Disparate hypsometry and consequential recession pattern variations of the glaciers originating from a single source in the Himachal Himalaya, India

We present here a study of the diverse regions and behavior of the glaciers from a single source with varied aspects and dynamics. We have analyzed the terminus recession patterns and frontal area loss of 10 glaciers extending on various aspects from the Meadless peak (Himachal Himalaya). All the studied glaciers show the recession of terminus during the study period, though with an erratic pattern of recession rates. The largest glacier among all, i.e., the Beas glacier, is retreating at an overall annual rate of 8.13±0.21 m a⁻¹ since 1921, with a minimum retreat rate of 10.01±0.36 m a⁻¹ between 1971 and 2000 and a minimum rate of 5.78±0.35 m a⁻¹ during the most recent phase, i.e., 2013-2021. On the contrary, Meadless and the Chingal glaciers show the fastest retreat rates of 20.65±1.52 and 13.54±1.55 m a⁻¹, respectively, during the most recent phase (2013-2021). Contrastingly, the Zaskar and the Chaska glaciers show the fastest annual retreat rates during the 2000-2013 period (25.77±0.19 and 3.24±0.19 m a⁻¹, respectively). We analyzed the climate data for the last one century, however, no meteorological data was available. Therefore, climatic trends apply to all the glaciers. Therefore, we attribute the disparate glacier recession patterns to the variations in the topographic features, mainly glacier hypsometry and valley geometry.



