ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur, recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956 is a constituent college of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla established as Arya College for girls in June, 1978 with a meagre strength of 20 girls situated at the . The institution was started in the sacred memory of **Swami Dayanand Saraswati** whose name stands among the greatest social and religious reformers of modern India, who propounded that knowledge should be imparted without prejudice of caste, creed and sex and that the basic purpose of propagating real education is to inculcate love for Indian cultural ethics in consonance with the Vedic ideas of universal brotherhood.

The Arya College for girls was taken over by the Government of Himachal Pradesh on **25th June, 2002** as a co-educational institution and named as **Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur** with only Humanities. From the academic session 2009-10, Science (Medical & Non- Medical) and commerce classes were also started thereby fulfilling the long-standing demand and aspirations of the people of the area.

The University Grants Commission launched an employment-oriented scheme on Skill Development as a part of College/ University education. This vocational degree programme (**B. Voc.**) was started in our college w.e.f. June 2017 with two courses having 40 seats each, one in **Retail Management** and other in **Hospitality & Tourism**.

Having made a mark on the educational horizon of the Himachal Pradesh University, our college strives to create an environment conducive to continuous academic, co-curricular activities and holistic development of students as well as staff members. 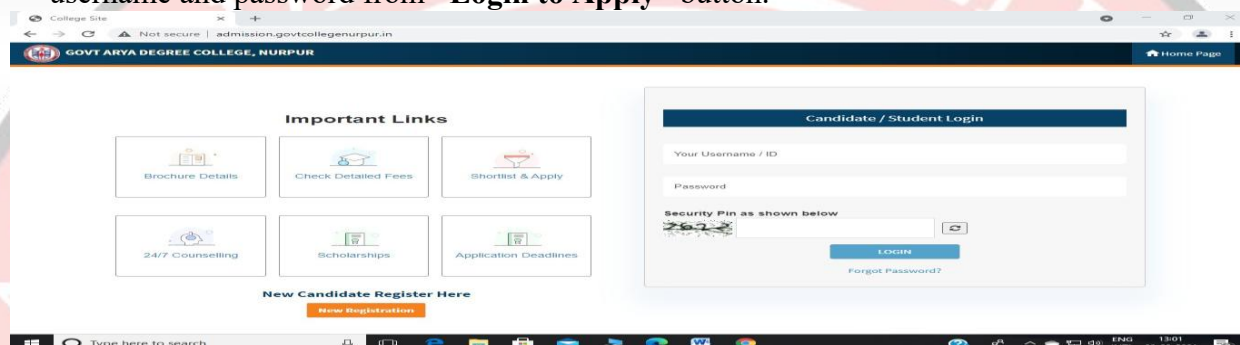

PROCEDURE FOR ONLINE ADMISSION FOR THE SESSION 2025-26

Candidates/Parents/Guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and check the college website <https://gadcnurpur.edu.in> from time to time as the admission process will be online and submit the application form after completing in all respects through an online mode only. Kindly refer to the following link for the admission: -

<http://admission.gadcnurpur.edu.in>

1. Candidate must save the “Username and Password” generated during registration process with them and complete the admission process by filling the online application form using their own username and password from “Login to Apply” button.



2. Candidate needs to fill the online admission form using his/her own credentials, after that only his/her candidature will be considered for admission. Registration alone does not make any candidate eligible for admission. **At the time of registration, Rs. 50/- will be charged for college admission registration on college online admission portal (for 1st-year students only).** After registration, the students have to submit duly filled online application form with all required documents.
3. **Photostat Copies: - Only scanned copies of original documents are to be uploaded while applying for online admission. Photostat copies of documents are not accepted. If the admission committee finds any uploaded Photostat copy at the time of form verification, then the admission form will be rejected, and the candidate will have to rectify the rejected form from his / her account and resubmit it within stipulated time.**
4. At the time of form verification, the admission committee holds all the rights to reject any of the uploaded documents, if documents are not uploaded in the prescribed format mentioned in the instructions, then the student will be communicated by the committee through “SMS and E-mail” on their registered mobile number and E-mail address to do the needful changes.
5. The candidate then needs to make the corrections **by logging in to his/her account using his/her username and password and resubmit the form and wait for the final approval which will be intimated through SMS and E-mail.**
6. After the final approval from the admission committees, the date will be announced by the respective admission committees through SMS and E-mail on their registered mobile number. A link for the online payment of the fee will be sent on the registered E-mail and mobile number through a SMS.
7. **Candidate needs to pay the fee online to complete the admission process by logging into the account using his/her own username and password.**
8. In case of any query related to online admission, the candidate can contact the admission counselling committee.

RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. Candidates/ Parents/ Guardians must read all instructions given in the prospectus carefully and submit application form online after completing in all respects.
2. Admission will be strictly subjected to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria.
3. Any gap in the academic year of applicant must be supported by an undertaking/Affidavit by the candidate.
4. Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU notification from time to time.
5. **A candidate having compartment in 10+2 in any subject is not eligible for seeking admission in any course of 1st Year.**
6. Admission of a student is liable to cancellation if he/she uploads/produces incomplete/false information. In case of concealment of facts, disciplinary action will be taken against such candidates.
7. Girl students seeking admission to any course must upload the original copy of HP Bonafide Certificate for the fee concession.
8. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission of any student without assigning any reason or explanation.
9. **Students seeking exemption from fees and funds for the differently abled person "Divyang" must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate by the competent authority. They must contact the admission committee/ office for fee exemption.**
10. Students who have been expelled or suspended from any institution will not be eligible for admission.
11. Students from the National Open School will be eligible only if they are passed in all the five subjects including English.
12. All admissions are provisional and subject to final approval of HPU Shimla.
13. A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the university rules.

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS TO BE UPLOADED FOR ADMISSION

1. Original Matriculation Examination/Date of Birth Certificate.
2. Original Detailed Marks Card of 10+2 or equivalent examination.
3. Passport-size photograph of the candidate.
4. Original Character certificate from the institution last attended for regular students.
5. Original Character certificate (not older than 6 months) from the class-I Gazetted officer /Pradhan Gram Panchayat / Municipal Committee / Municipal Corporation for the students who have passed 10+2 or equivalent as a private candidate or have a gap year in studies.
6. SC/ST/ OBC/ EWS certificate issued by class-I Gazetted officer (if eligible).
7. Migration Certificate (in case of examination passed from other than H.P. Board).
8. An undertaking by the candidate for Gap year after 10+2.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITION FOR ADMISSION (For B.A. / B. Com./ B. Sc. 1st Year)

- Age Limit:** An applicant must **not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls)** of age as on **1st July of the year 2025** i.e. his / her date of birth must not be earlier than **01-07-2002 (01-07-2000 for girls)**. Only the Vice-Chancellor has the power to grant age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. *There is a relaxation of age limit up to 3 years for SC / ST students.*
- Minimum Pass Percentage for taking admission in different streams is given as: -**

Class	Minimum Percentage of marks required in 12 th class
B. A. 1st Year	33% marks in aggregate including all the subjects.
B. A. 1st Year with Mathematics	45% marks in aggregate or in Mathematics.
B.Sc. 1st Year (Physical sciences)	45% marks in aggregate in five subjects including English with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.
B.Sc. 1st Year (Life sciences)	45% marks in aggregate in five subjects including English with Biology.
B. Com. 1st Year	45% marks in aggregate with Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subject in 10+2 level (For girl students the minimum percentage is 33%)

As per the direction of the Hon'ble High Court, any candidate with compartment in 10+2 will not be eligible for seeking admission in any of the undergraduate courses.

**Note: - 1. There is a relaxation of percentage to SC / ST students as per HPU ordinance.
2. Rules regarding eligibility conditions for admission to B.A./B.Com./B.Sc.1st year are subject to change as per the directions of H. P. Govt. / H.P.U. Shimla.**

RULES FOR REFUSAL OF ADMISSION/ RE-ADMISSION

- Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal has the right to refuse admission in any of the following cases:**
 - If the conduct of the student has been found unsatisfactory during the previous session.
 - On the ground of inadequate capacity in a particular class.
 - On the grounds of indiscipline, misbehavior, misconduct, ragging including unruly riotous acts.
- Students found indulging in ragging shall be expelled from the college.**
- The name of a student who remains absent continuously for ten days without any sanctioned leave shall be struck off from the college rolls.**
- A student whose name has been struck off twice shall not be re-admitted in the session.**
- In case the name of the candidate is struck off because of continuous absence of 10 days or any indiscipline, the re-admission is permissible within one week subject to the satisfaction of concerned teachers/discipline committee with a re-admission fee of Rs.100/-failing which his / her name will stands struck off permanently.**
- In case, the name of candidate is struck off again because of any reason mentioned above, then the admission is permissible within one week on payment of Rs. 200/- as second re-admission fee in the presence of the parents only; failing which after 7 days his / her name will be permanently struck off the college roll and not be granted re-admission at all.**

- Our institution follows the reservation policy of HPU Shimla in admissions. The reservations are available which are filled according to the reservation roster constructed under the guidelines by HPU Shimla:
Schedule Caste (SC): 15 %, Schedule Tribe (ST): 7.5 %, Sports (SP): 5 %, Cultural Activities (CUL): 5 %, Persons with disability (PwD): 5%.
- Besides the above Reservation Roster, 10% reservation will be provided for EWS candidates.
- One supernumerary seat for a 'single girl child' candidate is reserved for each course provided she fulfills the minimum eligibility criteria.

FEES & FUNDS FOR THE SESSION 2025-26**Instructions for Payment of Fees & Funds: -**

- Every student must pay his / her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
 - Failure to pay dues on the due date will entail a fine of Rs. 01/-per day.
 - In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off at the end of that month.
 - The fine will be collected at the time of verification of roll numbers.
- The following categories of students are exempted from the payment of Tuition fee: -**

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Pursuing the aim to enhance and give a boost to enrolment in Higher Education, the University Grants Commission has proposed **Rashtriya Uchch Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)**. Under this programme, the CBCS has been introduced with a vision to enhance the quality of education. The new UGC CBCS system has been approved and adopted by the Department of Higher Education and H.P.U Shimla since session 2016-17 and the admission for the session 2025-26 will also be in accordance with the new system and list of Undergraduate Programs to be covered under CBCS as per the U.G.C. guidelines.

BACHELOR COURSES UNDER CBCS:

1. B. Sc. Life Sciences: (Botany, Zoology)
2. B. Sc. Physical Sciences: (Physics, Mathematics & Chemistry/Computer Applications)
3. B. A. (Bachelor of Arts)
4. B. Com. (Bachelor of Commerce)

OUTLINE OF CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM:

1. Core Course: 4 Discipline Specific Core Courses (DSC) (2 per subject) and 2 Courses of English and Hindi in B.A./B. Com). The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also, the course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2. Elective Course: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope, and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline-related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by the main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: (2 each for B.A. /B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to

suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

Note: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** and **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**. "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; **i. Environmental Science and ii. English/Hindi/MIL Communication**. These are mandatory for all disciplines. **SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.**

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/fieldwork. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students with life-skills in the hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category is suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope, and need.

3.3 Practical/tutorials: - (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. However, the addition will be of a similar nature.

CREDIT SCHEME

1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes four core courses each in two disciplines of choice, two core courses each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, two Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum four Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), two courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two courses from the list of Generic Electives courses.

2. An undergraduate degree in science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes four core courses each in three disciplines of choice, two Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum of four Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), and two courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.

3. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:

- i) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one-hour duration per week
- ii) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one-hour duration per week
- iii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two-hour duration per week

IMPORTANT

The Principal of the college will have the right to refuse admission to a candidate during the session on grounds of ragging, indiscipline, misbehavior and conduct including unruly acts and non-observance of the code of discipline. The admission for the 2nd and 3rd Year will be as per University/Govt. Notification.

Academic Qualification: A student must pass in the senior secondary (+2) Examination conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education, C.B.S.E. or an examination accepted as equivalent by H P University / S P University: -

- I. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. 1st Year.
- II. Provided that candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B. Com 1st Year.
- III. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts, Stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. 1st Year.

The candidates applying for the Science stream should have passed 10+2 Examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board/University with any of the three subjects out of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or any other science subject with 45% or equivalent grade. For SC/ST candidate the required eligibility will be 40% or equivalent grade.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE DEGREE

1. Eligibility for Three-Year Degree Programmes

- 1.1. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College affiliated to the H.P. University for a period of not less than three academic year & (and not more than five academic years) pass the examination and fulfil such conditions as have been prescribed, therefore.
- 1.2. There shall be no private or other category of students. The student shall be eligible for a degree either through regular mode or through distance education mode only.
- 1.3. For the degree (B. A. / B. Sc. / B. Com), the student will have to earn a minimum of 132 successful credits hours of course work for over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission.

2. Choosing Programme Study Courses: -

- 2.1. At the time of admission, each student will identify a Core (main) subject in which he/she will concentrate and Core-II (allied) elective subject in which he/she would choose to study
- 2.2. Core subject once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and joins a new programme.
- 2.3. In these subjects the student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of credits in order to qualify for the UG degree.
- 2.4. The degree of the student will be awarded as B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. on the basis of the stream chosen.

ABOUT THE BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B. Voc.) DEGREE PROGRAMME

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched an employment-oriented scheme on skill Development-based higher education as a part of College / University education, leading to a Bachelor of Vocation (B. Voc.) degree with multiple entry and exit at different levels viz. Diploma / Advance diploma and degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF). Multiple entry and exit will allow students the flexibility to earn and study at their convenience.

OBJECTIVES: -

- * To provide multiple entry and exit options at various levels through program design in confirmation of the skill ecosystem.
- * To create requisite job role-specific skilled manpower for the industry at various NSQF levels as per NOS's (National Occupational Standards).
- * To empower the youth leading to employment and income-generating opportunities.
- * To provide a judicious mix of skills relating to a profession and appropriate content of general Education.

COURSE STRUCTURE

B. Voc. program is designed with the provision for multiple exit levels. All the candidates enrolled for diploma courses or further will be treated at par from the second semester onwards. Students may exit after six months with the certificate (NSQF Level 4) or they may continue for diploma or Advanced Diploma level courses leading to B. Voc. degree.

Following table provides a snapshot of the various certificates and their duration: -

Multiple Entry and Exit Options:

- After the completion of Semester I, the candidate will get a Certificate, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may re-join Semester II. After the completion of Semester II, the candidate will get a Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may re-join Semester III. After the completion of Semesters III and IV. The candidate will get an Advanced Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may re-join Semester V. After the completion of Semesters V and VI, the candidate will be awarded a B. Voc. Degree, and she/he may go for a job or become an entrepreneur, or continue studying for the M. Voc. Degree (NSQF Level 8 onwards) and can register for Ph.D. Degree (NSQF Level 10) after it, in Vocational studies, or they can take admission in any other masters' programme after completion of required Bridge course, or appear in any competitive exams conducted by State Public Service Commission and Union Public Service Commission.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM:

- Internship for 6 weeks after the completion of each year is an integral/essential component of B. Voc. Degree.
- The Internship shall also carry credits to be added in the final evaluation of skill components.
- **HPKVN (HP Kaushal Vikas Nigam)** is fully sponsoring the internship apart from facilitating the skill component (60%) of this programme along with courseware for whole of the programme.
- Candidates enrolled for this programme are entitled for 'Kaushal Vikas Bhatta' as per state government policy.

The candidate may become a "Revenue Manager" in Hospitality & Tourism related industries as well as explore opportunities to become an entrepreneur.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR B. VOC.

- Admission to the B.Voc. programme will be as per the rules and regulations of the Himachal Pradesh University.
- The eligibility criteria for admission to the B.Voc. Degree programme shall be 10+2 in all streams from a recognized board; 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereof from a Board/University established by law in India with **English as a compulsory subject with 45% marks in aggregate.**
- Vocational subjects under NSQF will be given weightage, equivalent to any other general education subject while considering admission to students to the undergraduate courses as per reference no. DD No.. 1-52/2013(CC/NSQF) dated 30.04.2014 of UGC.
- Maximum age limit for admission to B. Voc. courses is 23 years for the general category, 25 years for SC/ST category and 25 years for girl candidates, as on 1st July of the admission year. Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation as per norms.
- Reservation rules are applicable as per the rules or guidelines of the Himachal Pradesh Government.
- Students belonging to SC/ST category shall be given a 5% relaxation in marks for admission purposes, i.e., they would require a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate at 10+2 level.**
- Compartment students shall not be allowed admission in the B. Voc. Courses.
- A candidate cannot pursue two full-time undergraduate courses simultaneously.
- The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.
- In matters relating to undergraduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, shall be final.
- All legal matters pertaining to undergraduate admissions shall be subjected to the Himachal Pradesh jurisdiction only.

MODE OF SELECTION

- Admission to the B. Voc. course in Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism (Semester- I) shall be done purely on merit basis in the qualifying examination (10+2 etc.) .
- There are three categories of candidates who shall be given admission in Semester-I of the skill-based courses under NSQF

Category 1: Students who have already acquired NSQF certification Level 4 in a particular Industry sector may opt for admission in the skill-based courses under NSQF.

Category 2: Students who have acquired NSQF certification Level 4, but may like to change their trade and enter into skill-based courses in a different trade.

Category 3: Students who have passed the 10+2 examination with conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

Note: - Regarding the selection of students for B. Voc. programme, 10% extra weightage shall be given to Category-1; 5% extra weightage shall be given to Category-2 in 10+2 examination. Final list of students shall be finalized on merit.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES IN THE COLLEGE

THE HOLY FIG ECO CLUB: -

College has an Eco Club, The Holy Fig Eco Club, which aims at the environmental development as well as the fostering of a greater sense of environmental responsibility among our community, particularly our youth. The inspiration behind naming our Eco Club as "The Holy Fig Eco Club" comes from the pervasive presence and profound significance of the Peepal (Ashvatha) or the Holy Fig tree in our region. The Peepal is not merely a common sight in Nurpur; it is a sacred symbol woven into the very fabric of our daily lives and spiritual beliefs. Its abundance in Nurpur reveals a long-standing reverence for nature, and its religious importance. It is common to see these majestic trees adorning temples, village squares, and even individual homes, often draped with sacred threads and serving as focal points for prayers and community gatherings. By naming our eco-club "The Holy Fig Eco Club", we aim to draw upon the inherent respect for the Peepal tree, connecting our environmental efforts to a deeply rooted cultural understanding of nature's sanctity. The Eco Club of our College will work for the protection and nurturing of the natural world, just as our ancestors have revered the holy fig tree for generations.

ENERGY CLUB: -

The energy club for the implementation of the energy conservation program, Bureau of energy efficiency (BEE) under the Ministry of Power, Govt. of India, has been started in the college from this session. This club is formed to propagate energy conservation values amongst students and encourage the participation of young ambassadors in the energy-saving movement.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC): -

The college has a unit of NCC. The officer commanding 9 HP Bn NCC, Dalhousie has sanctioned two NCC platoons of 134 cadets to the college. NCC cadets will be selected by the Official Staff of 9 HP Bn NCC, Dalhousie as per the directions of DG NCC, in 1st year. The cadets participate in various camps such as Republic Day Parades Camp, EBSB Camp, TSC, Army Att. Camp, etc.

TUTORIAL GROUPS:

Every student is assigned a tutorial group which is normally consisted of 40-50 students. Each group is guided by a member of the faculty who is their tutor. The students have to seek the advice of their tutor for all problems. They have to get their identity card signed by the concerned tutor/senior tutor. Identity cards must be complete in all respects within 15 days after admission.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The National Service Scheme is currently comprised of 100 volunteers. The enrolment is made by Programme Officer on the basis of selection. In every academic session, our students participate in a number of social programmes organized in the college and outside the college.

RED RIBBON CLUB

In order to raise awareness level regarding the dreaded HIV/AIDS, blood donation, drug abuse, and other related issues, the college has constituted Red Ribbon Club.

ROVERS & RANGERS UNITS

The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a registered society under Societies Registration Act. It is a voluntary, non-political, and secular organization. It is the largest youth movement. The college has two units of this organization. The objective of the units is to create in each student the qualities of personal dignity, poise graciousness, and social maturity.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

College is a platform for creative buds to recognize their talent and to provide them a platform for the manifestation of their creativity, the College has a magazine namely "HIMNOOR" which is published annually. The magazine has eight sections. Each section is edited by a member of editorial team and is also assisted by a student editor. Interested students can approach the Editorial Staff for any guidance in this regard so that their original thoughts and creativity can be presented in the right section of the college magazine.

SVEEP

Govt of India has started a special program to enhance voter awareness and knowledge about the election system of our country and register new voters in the voter list, to update addresses, photos and other credentials. This programme is called Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation. Under the SVEEP programme, our college has also created SVEEP Club to achieve the above-mentioned objectives.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT CELL

Disaster Management Cell has also been created in our college to aware and train students about different types of disasters. In every academic session, students participate in different awareness, training and mock drill programmes.

CAREER GUIDANCE & PLACEMENT CELL:

After passing a secondary school, a student reaches the threshold of career development. So, a career Guidance and Placement cell has been established in the college to provide guidance and proper counselling to the students regarding their future prospects and career, vitally taking their qualifications and interest into account. Information related to job avenues is also displayed on the notice board from time to time.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES:

The college provides facilities to those who wish to make a mark in sports. College sends teams for various University Championships like Athletics, Chess, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kabaddi, Basketball, and Weightlifting (M/W). No student can play for an outside team without the written permission of the principal. The Annual Athletic Meet of the college is also another opportunity for the students to show their calibre and excellence in Athletics and Sports Activities.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Our college believes in the overall development of our students. We encourage our students to give expression to their skills. . Thus, our institution provides a platform for students to show their talent through various cultural activities at the university level Youth Festival, Inter- College and Intra- College Competition. They also get a chance to participate in debate, declamation, poetic recitation, elocution, quiz, drama, skit, mime, group dance, light vocal, etc.

Important Note: Prior permission of parents and concerned subject teacher is required for participating in any outdoor activity, H.P.U. Shimla Youth Festival and Inter-College competitions.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The PTA is a formal organization to strengthen the role of parents in the institution for the betterment of their wards and also to protect their interests. Parents of students contribute towards the PTA fund at the time of admission and work towards smooth functioning of the college.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

1. Educational tours are also arranged for students during the winter vacation. The routes will be recommended by the concerned committee and approved by the principal.
2. For each tour, the Teacher in charge fixes the itinerary with other members of the committee.
3. The college provides limited financial support as permitted under the rules.
4. Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours.

DEAR PARENTS

- Your co-operation will enable us to take better care of your ward.
- A student must produce an original certificate at the time of admission.
- Students must always possess identity cards in the college campus & on demand, it has to be shown to the college authority.
- Entry to the college campus will be on an identity card basis.
- Bringing unwanted and unauthorized people to the campus is strictly prohibited.
- Pasting any kind of poster/bill/Notice on the campus wall without the permission of the principal is strictly prohibited.
- Cell phones are strictly prohibited outside the authorized area allotted in the college campus.
- Defaulters are liable to be fined and punished.

CODE OF CONDUCT / DISCIPLINE

Every student is required to maintain discipline and observe the code of discipline in or outside the college campus. The following is the code of discipline for the students of this college. Any act of indiscipline will invite disciplinary action against the delinquents.

- i) Each student is required to possess his/her valid identity card and show it to the college authorities on demand. Students without identity cards may be asked to leave the college campus. Habitual offenders will be fined and strictly dealt with.
- ii) Ragging of any kind is legally banned. Any student found indulging in ragging will be prosecuted and expelled from the college.
- iii) Mobile phones are not allowed on the college campus at all.
- iv) The use of intoxicants including smoking, drinking, chewing tobacco, paan and drugs are banned in the college. Any infringement of the ban will invite disciplinary action in the form of fines, suspension, and rustication from the college.
- v) Bringing outsiders to the college campus by students will be considered as a violation of the code of conduct, leading to disciplinary action as may be deemed fit by the Disciplinary Committee. However, the Parents/Guardians of a student may meet their wards with the permission of the principal.
- vi) Writing slogans on the walls, sticking bills of student's organization in the College Campus, putting private notice on the Notice Board without permission, writing obscene remarks on the black boards, walls or furniture of the college is strictly prohibited. Any student found indulging in these activities will be fined, suspended or expelled from the college.
- vii) The code of discipline requires security and maintenance of the college property by the students. Any one causing damage to the college property, its furniture, electric/tubes etc. will be required to pay for the damages caused as well as the special fine can also be imposed.
- viii) Rioting, shouting slogans, eve-teasing, misbehavior with fellow students, teachers & non-teaching staff are considered serious acts of indiscipline. The delinquents are liable to disciplinary action.
- ix) Any other act which is considered unbecoming of students by the discipline committee will be treated as violation of the code of conduct and disciplinary action will be taken against such students.
- x) Aimlessly loitering in the verandas/corridors in free period, sitting on the railing in front of the classrooms / Library area, attempts to disturb classes are viewed seriously. Any violation will entail disciplinary action.
- xi) Students are not allowed to take any chair/bench out of the classrooms for sitting in the verandas without permission of the college authorities.

Leave Rules

- i. A student can avail leave with prior permission after properly applying for leave on prescribed leave form.
- ii. A tutor can recommend leave up to 3 days. A student must get an application signed by senior tutor for leave up to 7 days.
- iii. Leave during house examination will be sanctioned by the college principal on the recommendation of senior tutor.
