About the Institution

Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur, Dist. Kangra (H.P.) recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956, is a constituent college of Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. It was established as Arya College for Girls in June 1978 with a meagre strength of 20 girls. The institution was started in the sacred memory of Swami Dayanand Saraswati, whose name stands among the greatest social and religious reformers of modern India, who propounded that knowledge should be imparted without prejudice of caste, creed and sex and that the basic purpose of propagating real education is to inculcate love for Indian cultural ethics in consonance with the Vedic ideas of universal brotherhood.

The Arya College for Girls was taken over by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh on 25th June 2002 as a co-educational institution and named as Govt. Arya Degree College, Nurpur with only Humanities. From the academic session 2009-10, this institution also started Science (Medical & non-medical) and commerce classes, thereby fulfilling the long-standing demand and aspirations of the people of this area.

The University Grants Commission launched an employment-oriented scheme on skill development as a part of college/ university education. This vocational degree programme (B. Voc.) started in our college w.e.f. June 2017 with two courses having 40 seats each, one in Retail Management and the other in Hospitality & Tourism.

Having made a mark on the educational horizon of the Himachal Pradesh University, our college strives to create an environment conducive to continuous academic, and co-curricular activities and holistic development of students as well as staff members. For this purpose, consistent efforts have always been made by all stakeholders to foster, encourage and motivate ideas and put them into practice. College tries to inculcate all the values enshrined in our constitution; the values of liberty, equality, justice and brotherhood. We encourage a sense of tolerance for different cultures and opinions among our students.

1.	Mode of Teaching Response: ii. Blended Teachings (Link) Our college Govt. Arya Degree College Nurpur promotes blended teaching methods in order to provide comprehensive teaching to our students. We aim at the combined use of lecture method and technology for teaching. College has a staff of 22 teachers in the U.G. Program (Science, Commerce, Arts). There are 6 trainers and 4 guest faculty teachers in B.Voc. Program. The college has well equipped classrooms and smart classrooms. Teachers are allotted smart class rooms in their time table schedule, so that every teacher uses the ICT to enhance the effectiveness and make teaching comprehensible to students. The students of college also participate in teaching learning methods as a part of presentations and seminars etc. iii. Flipped Classrooms (Link) Response: Teaching learning process is made more interactive and bounteous by flipping the classrooms. The students of college are given home assignments. 	Response: Projects: December 2024 The project works were assigned to B.Sc. 1st, 2nd and 3rd year students during December 2024. The project work assigned to B.Sc. 1st year students was on the topic ‘Survey of Fauna within surroundings of a village/ town’ from each student’s home area as a part of coursework for DSC paper Animal Diversity (ZOOL101PR). The project work assigned to B.Sc. 2nd year students was on the topic ‘Study of Human genetic Traits’ as a part of coursework from DSC paper Genetics and Evolutionary Biology (ZOOL202PR) and on choice-based topics from SEC-I /SEC-II papers Medical Diagnostics (ZOOL203TH)/ Apiculture (ZOOL204TH). The project work assigned to B.Sc. 3rd year students was on choice-based topics from DSE papers Animal Biotechnology (ZOOL301(B)TH)/ Reproductive Biology (ZOOL302(C)TH; and SEC papers Sericulture (ZOOL303 TH/ Aquarium Fish Keeping (ZOOL304 TH). Internal assessment mechanisms (quizzes, class test, presentation, assignment, MTT etc. (Link) Response: Quizzes • Quiz Competition on ‘Wildlife of Himachal Pradesh and India’ (07-10-2024) : A quiz competition on ‘Wildlife of Himachal Pradesh and India’ was organised on 7th October 2024 in the college campus. In total, 18 students of 6 teams A, B, C, D, E & F (three students in each team) participate in it. Three teams were selected for the top three positions, • A quiz competition was organized on 26-09-2024 on the topic, 'Environmental Awareness' by the department of Botany. Around 70 students were present in this program. Class tests The teachers of each stream of the college regularly give class tests in their classes according to the schedule. The record of these tests is retained by the teachers in their departments. Presentations The presentations are regularly taken from students in the classrooms to enhance their knowledge of the subject and make them aware of the use of the ICT. It helps students to polish their eloquence and communication skills. Assignments The assignments are given to students by their teachers for each course / paper. The assignments are submitted by students to their subject teachers and these are evaluated as a part of their internal assessment. 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	obtained in these assignments are counted for their internal assessment for final examination. MTT During each new session, Mid-Term Test / House Examination Committee is constituted for the smooth conduct of the Mid Term Tests. A notice regarding setting of question papers for each course is circulated among teachers and they are asked to set and submit the question papers of their respective subjects within a given time. The answer books and question papers are printed after completing all the codal formalities through proper channels. Date-sheet of all courses for MTT is prepared and displayed on the college notice board as well as communicated to all the students of college in their WhatsApp groups. The invigilation duties are assigned to teachers by making a proper duty chart and this is circulated among teachers through WhatsApp groups and in person also. The seating plan of candidates for each day's examination is prepared well in advance and circulated among students through WhatsApp groups a day before examination as well as displayed on the college notice board on the day of examination. For the smooth conduct of examination, other non-teaching staff members including class iv are also assigned duties. The answer scripts are given to teachers for evaluation after examination is over and asked to submit the award lists of their respective courses in the college office within a given specified time. The evaluated answer scripts are also shown to students so that they can check their mistakes. The marks obtained in each course/paper are added to CCA as a part of internal assessment. v. Workshop on Making a Terrarium – Adding Life to Bottles & Jars: Department of Botany and Eco club of Govt. Dr. Anil Kumar Thakur, Principal Govt. Arya Degree College Nurpur; who guided participants through the process of creating terrariums and bottle gardens. He covers the topics like plant selection, layering techniques, soil and moisture management and design aesthetics. 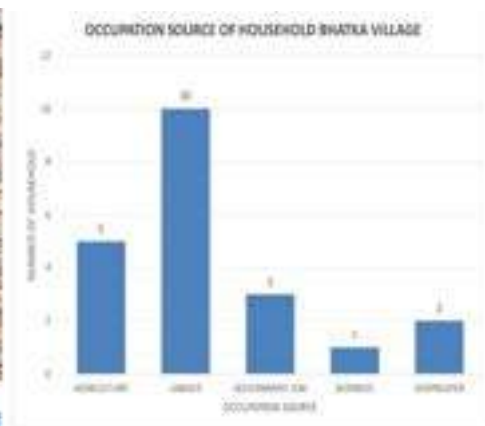


Figure 5: Occupational details of Bhatka village

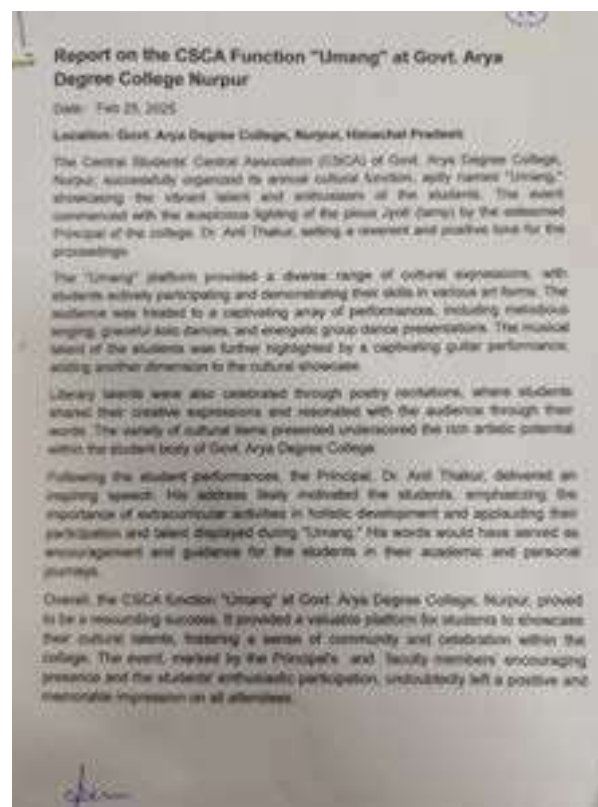

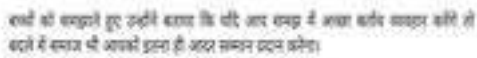

Dr. Angeles Romero, the director general of Humanist Action, described the initiative as dividing responsibility equally in those and by training for the human challenge of coexistence.
